Caring for your neighbours

This can be difficult at times when you feel concerned about your neighbours within the village who are living within close proximity to you.

But there is a difference between showing care and support and respecting someone's right to privacy, and there are some questions you may ask, such as:

- When do you raise concerns for someone's wellbeing?
- Who do you contact?
- Do you check on people if you notice any changes in behaviours or routine?
- Do you need to notify someone if you are concerned?
- What is your duty of care regarding others in the village?

The answers to these questions will differ for each of us but maybe there are some general guidelines you can develop by having discussions with those living close to you.

Everyone has personal opinions and preferences regarding assistance and rights to privacy – so we encourage you to have a discussion with your neighbours in your community, and develop some understanding, general guidelines and awareness.

We may all need support at some time – so let's work together to make sure we're all on the same page.
